## Background

All students in the Division are to receive instruction in Canadian citizenship and participate in patriotic observances and exercises in order to provide focus to the importance of these exercise in society.

## Procedures

1. Each school is to display a photograph of the current Monarch in a highly visible location.
2. Each school is to display the Canadian and Saskatchewan flags. (Refer to <http://www.pch.gc.ca/pgm/ceem-cced/etiqt/101-eng.cfm#a2>.)
3. Each school is to display the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms.
4. Students are to stand respectfully as “O Canada” is sung and/or played prior to all school assemblies and the beginning of each school day. Schools are to allow for the recognition of diverse religious practices in terms of “O Canada”.
5. Each school is to play “O Canada” at graduation ceremonies.
6. Playing or singing of “O Canada” at school assemblies and sporting activities may be seen as appropriate.
7. Remembrance Day is to be observed by all schools.
