Bullying Awareness Week Proclaimed by Education Minister Don Morgan

One hundred and ten students from the Sun West School Division and students from school divisions across the province will participate in a Youth Forum to recognize Bullying Awareness Week this week.

More than 9,000 Saskatchewan students in Grades 6 through 12 will be participating in the province's largest ever Student First Anti-Bullying Youth Forum. This is the first year that students have been able to participate from their own school, which includes students from Loreburn Central School, Kindersley Composite School, Elizabeth Middle School and Harris Tessier Central School.

The theme of this year's forum is Stand-Up to Bullying: Activating the Bystander. The forum started today at 9:30 a.m. with a live broadcast from Regina's Campbell Collegiate to schools across the province where students will watch in real time.

Throughout the remainder of the week, teachers will lead students through a series of activities about responsible online behaviour. On November 19th a province-wide online chat will focus on being respectful and supportive of each other online. Students are also encouraged to create a multimedia project to share their ideas about creating safe and caring schools and online communities.
