As part of its 2023-26 Education Plan, Sun West is implementing evidence-based assessment practices that guide and strengthen responsive instruction and personalized learning opportunities.


Sun West is also continuing to focus on student mastery of foundational literacy and math outcomes.

HIGHLIGHTS

Sun West students and staff live up to the Sun West vision statement, "Success for All," in many different ways. These are a small number of examples.

In September 2023, the Sun West Leadership Team started the year of with its Travelling Road Show that took 11 team members to nine schools where they spoke to over 400 students about the Student Leadership Program. As a result, the annual Sun West Student Leadership Seminar in October attracted 75 students from every Sun West school with a Grades 8-12 component, making it one of the largest seminars ever!

Sun West athletes were great competitors on regional, district and provincial levels. Of particular note, the Davidson Raiders Senior Girls Volleyball Team won gold at 2023 provincials and two Rosetown Central High School athletes, Dami Igbekoyi and Taya Green, both won gold at 2023 Provincial Track and Field.

Sun West students avidly participate in extracurricular activities and contribute hours in community service while still doing well academically. Two students, Jill Dobbin, a graduate of Kindersley Composite School and Jan Nasibog, a Grade 11 student at Rosetown Central High School have been recognized for excelling in all these areas. Jill received a full four-year scholarship to Carleton University in Ottawa and is a past recipient of the Vimy Foundation Award. Jan was selected from the Saskatchewan Youth Council and is also receiving the Vimy Foundation Award.

In 2022 and 2023, Sun West held a Student Art Contest. During these two years over 500 PreK-12 Sun West students created paintings and drawings suitable for display in the Sun West Division Office in Rosetown. The artwork captured life in Sun West School Division in many diverse, beautiful and wonderful ways.




